Gwen Steele - 'Plants that Shine'

With vivid photos, Okanagan xeriscape expert Gwen Steele shares her passion for lush, water-wise plants. To be in this presentation of her favourites, plants must be easy-maintenance and have three seasons of interest. Xeriscaping is gardening with nature. Gwen is passionate about gardening with nature as a way to restore and preserve natural systems and to bring peace and good health to individuals.

Biography:

Gwen Steele has gardened in Kelowna since early childhood. She was the co-founder and owner of the first xeriscape plant nursery in the Okanagan. Many plants were trialed for drought tolerance in the ½ acre demonstration gardens.

For over 20 years Gwen has studied, practiced and taught xeriscaping. She feels this is the most simple, cost effective, and rewarding method of gardening. The Principles of Xeriscape can be used to create almost any style of garden.

Gwen is currently the executive director of the Okanagan Xeriscape Association (a not-for-profit organization) which she co-founded in 2009. It was formed to bring water-wise gardening education to Okanagan Valley residents.

Danielle Toperczer - 'ISC Plantwise Ambassador Program'

Danielle has worked with the Council since 2010, and manages large ISC projects and fund development. Her past work experience includes fisheries surveys, range management and not-for-profit work. She is a Professional Agrologist and lives in Coldstream where she enjoys hiking, camping and gardening with her husband and children.
